Counseling Licensure Requirements: New Hampshire

Licensed Professional Counseling

Educational Requirement:

- All applicants shall have a master's degree or doctoral degree in clinical mental health counseling from a CACREP accredited institution OR have a 60-credit degree in clinical mental health counseling or its equivalent from a program which has received regional accreditation from the Association Secondary Schools and Colleges. A minimum of one academic year of full-time graduate study in mental health counseling must be completed in residence at the institution granting the degree. There are 11 content areas.
- *A degree from a CACREP accredited program will be required beginning in 2022.

Experiential Requirements:

- 2 years/3,000 hours of paid post-master's supervised clinical work experience in a mental health setting, to be completed in no more than 5 years.
- Each year shall not be less than 1,500 clock hours.100 hours of face-to-face supervision provided by a state-licensed, board approved, mental health professional is required.

Exam Required: NCMHCE and an essay exam provided by the board
