Breathing Signs

If a word begins with a vowel, that vowel is marked with what is called a breathing sign. There are two breathing signs: smooth and rough. If a word has a smooth breathing sign, the vowel is given its original value; if it has a rough breathing mark, it is pronounced and transliterated with an initial h before the vowel.

smooth breathing sign = ' rough breathing sign = ' ἀντί = anti (against)
'ιῶτα = iota
άρμονία = harmonia (harmony)
ὥρα = hora (time)
