## The Infinitive continued

1<sup>st</sup> Aorist Active 1<sup>st</sup> Aorist Passive 2<sup>nd</sup> Aorist Passive

λύσαι to loose λυθῆναι to be loosed γραφῆναι to be written

## Perfect Active

λελυκέναι to have loosed

## Perfect Passive

λελύσθαι to have been loosed

## The Imperative

The imperative is the form of the verb used for commands, motions, entreaties, and prohibitions. In Greek, it occurs in the second person and third person. "Let" or "must," with its appropriate pronoun, is the key word in translating the third person.

2 sg	λύου	λύθητι	(You) Be loosed!
3 sg	λύέσθω	λυθήτω	Let him be loosed!
2 pl	λύεσθε	λύθητε	(You) Be Loosed!
3 pl	λύέσθωσαν	λυθήτωσαν	Let them be loosed!
